Community Transport Waltham Forest (CTWF) is a certified social enterprise which has been awarded the Social Enterprise Mark.

(www.socialenterprisemark.org.uk)

This means that Community Transport Waltham Forest has proved its worth against independently-assessed criteria for social enterprise. The Mark provides assurance that our profits/surpluses are used to improve the quality of life of people in the areas where we operate. It acts as a guarantee that any profits are used to help people and the planet, rather than to pay dividends to shareholders.

Transport is provided either through specialist vehicles, to accommodate varying mobility needs, or by supporting our member organisations so they can serve their members or the public at large. Our Waltham Forest Community Driving School provides a range of transport related training to improve driving standards and assist individuals in achieving nationally accredited training in the transport field.

#### Director's Report Helen Tredoux

I am pleased to report that 2022/23 has been a very busy and successful year for the organisation. We have welcomed a cohort of new drivers and PA's to our team. Our increased capacity has enabled us to continue to deliver services and address new members joining from neighbouring boroughs. A key task moving forward is to work with agencies such as CTAuk and the London CT Forum to address the lack of community transport services in the East London area to ensure those organisations that need transport support are able to access transport services.

Towards the close of the financial year we received the wonderful news that we had been awarded Heritage Lottery funds for our project Charabancs and Cadillacs -reminiscing in Newham. No other Community Transport Service has been awarded Heritage Lottery Funds so we will be trailblazing for the sector and the next two years promise to be very busy.

We are continuing with our plans to have a fully ULEZ compliant Fleet by 2025 and have only two vehicles left to replace, during the last financial year we replaced a further 3 vehicles. Prices of secondhand vehicles have increased exponentially, and we have had to make some prudent decisions regarding replacements. Continuing the environmental theme, we are now a certified Green Small Business and are continuing to explore ways to minimize our environmental impact.



Community Transport Waltham Forest is a registered charity under the terms of the Charities Act 2006.

The objects of Community Transport Waltham Forest are to relieve poverty, youth, age, sickness or disability by the provision of transport to individuals in need of such relief or to charitable bodies established for the benefit of such individuals.

Community Transport Waltham Forest makes a contribution to the following charitable purposes as set out in the Charities Act:


- · The prevention or relief of poverty

The public benefit and Social value from these charitable purposes is widespread and comes through the delivery of community transport services to the wider voluntary sector and those individuals accessing our services to undertake their everyday essentials. From access to transport for shopping, health and social care services to participation in clubs and societies.

Our minibus group provision offers use of vehicles on an adhoc basis to clubs and societies, educational facilities as and when required.

#### Our membership

CTWF provides transport and training to local organisations in East London, the closure of neighbouring Community Transport Services has led to an increase in demand for our services. In 2022/23 we had 107 active member organisations spanning a wide range of voluntary, community and statutory organisations. The breakdown of membership at the end March 2023 showed:



#### **Our Staff**

We have a small compliment of back-office staff 3 F/T and 2 P/T and a pool of more than 23 drivers and passenger assistants who deliver our services. Our staff are recruited primarily from the local areas where we deliver services. Our staff are representative of the communities we serve, and unusually in the transport sector, the senior management team are all women. We worked in partnership with LBWF Job brokerage Scheme this year and appointed a driver to assist in our services.

Community Transport qualifies under the sunset period to 2025 for welfare vehicles. This year we replaced a further four vehicles with compliant vehicles. Most of our fleet now meets the Euro 6 standard. The remaining vehicles will be replaced in 2023/24.



#### **Get Up and Go Services**





The main area of Community Transport Waltham Forest's charitable activity is the provision of a minibus transport service to registered member groups either on a self drive basis or with driver provided. Many of our member organisations were unable to operate which is reflected in the reduction of services this year.

## Community Transport Waltham Forest (CTWF) Treasurer Report (31st March 2022) Richard Mundy

#### **Overall**

Unaudited Accounts show a surplus of £214,248 in 2022/23 (£151,701 in 2021/22). After allowing £5,769 for restricted items and £570,000 for designated purposes, general reserves are £452,489 (last year £613,241). Our tangible assets (vehicles) are valued at £316,157, leaving free reserves of £136,332 (£357,640).

Activity of member groups continued to return after Covid. We have been very busy and our drivers and passenger assistants, along with our office staff and Fleet Supervisor and Director have worked hard to meet member groups' needs.

We acquired four more ULEZ-compliant minibuses. Despite shortages in the vehicle market, leading to higher prices, we have been able to substantially modernize our fleet over recent years. We plan for further fleet renewal in 2023-2025.

As always, we continued caring for our staff. We are still one of the few transport employers paying the London Living Wage or more. Over the last five years we have been able to keep pay competitive and in line with the cost of living.

CTWF provides important services to the community and manages its finances cautiously. We have managed to keep increases to our charges to member groups well below inflation. We will continue offering reliable, quality, caring transport at competitive prices.

#### **Income**

- Total income was £1,477,105 (2021/22 £1,281,054).
- · Casual income from member groups was £229,178 (£143,115).
- Community Driving School income was £9,820 (£11,200).
- Committed income, with longer-term 'contracts' by members, plus Dial-a-Ride, was £1,198,813 (£1,081,827).
- Grants and Donations were £33,650 (£44,227). These included £10,000 from Awards for All and £500 from LB Newham's Jubilee fund.

#### **Expenditure**

Total expenditure was £1,262,857 (£1,129,353), reflecting increased activity and higher inflation during the year.

#### **Reserves and Cash**

- Total reserves at 31st March 2023 were £1,028,258 (£814,010).
- The Committee continued its cautious risk policy, with reserves designated for Fleet Renewal, Future Community Services, Core Costs, Working Capital and Potential Redundancy Costs in case of funding cuts (to us or our members).
- At 31st March cash balances were £530,001 (£370,125).
